

Esophageal Impedance pH Study

About Esophageal Impedance pH Testing

The provider performs the gastroesophageal reflux test to determine the backflow of acid from the stomach into the esophagus with a nasal catheter intraluminal impedance electrode placement for more than 1 hour and up to 24 hours. A computer records the data, which the provider interprets.

Indications for Use

Esophageal Impedance pH study is typically ordered for patients with gastroesophageal reflux disease, dysphagia (difficulty swallowing), heartburn, or other esophageal symptoms.

Billing
