

Crohn's disease: Working together for tomorrow



Enroll your child in a pediatric Crohn's disease study

The U-EMPOWER Study is looking at a potential new medication ("study medication") for children and teenagers with Crohn's disease (CD) who have already received previous treatment.

The study aims to find out if the study medication works for children and teenagers with CD. The study will also look at how safe the study medication is and how it is broken down in the body.

The study medication is designed to act on a protein in the body that is thought to be involved in the inflammation in the bowel that causes the symptoms of CD. It is hoped that this study could help to provide a new treatment option for young people who still have CD symptoms despite having received treatment.

Your child may be able to take part if they:

- are 2–17 years of age
- have been diagnosed with moderate to severe CD
- have previously received treatment for CD that has not worked.

This study has been reviewed by an Institutional Review Board (IRB)/Ethics Committee (EC), which protects the rights, safety, and well-being of participants.
